When Girl Scouts come to camp, they do more than just have fun! Our camp programming is designed to help girls grow and benefit through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience.

1

Strong Sense of Self

Girl Scouts have confidence in themselves and their abilities; they form positive identities.

At camp, campers are encouraged to try new activities and practice their skills. Campers have the freedom to choose extra activity rotations to add to their daily schedule.

2

Healthy Relationships

Girl Scouts develop and maintain healthy relationships by communicating their feelings.

In a group living setting like camp, conflict can happen. When it does, our trained counselors discuss any disagreements with campers and help them solve their conflict constructively.

3

Challenge Seeking

Girl Scouts take appropriate risks, try things even if they might fail, and learn from their mistakes.

At camp, our staff instructors are trained to supervise their specialty area and engage campers in healthy risk taking. Campers can try "challange by choice" in an encouraging, uplifting environment.

4

Positive Values

Girl Scouts act ethically, honestly and responsibly, and show concern for others.

Campers learn to share responsibility in keeping their living area clean and assisting in cleaning areas shared by all camp during daily "kapers."

5

Community Problem Solving

Girl Scouts desire to contribute to the world in purposeful and meaningful ways, learn how to identify problems in the community, and create "action plans" to solve them.

As a part of our group living environment at camp, campers create their own rules for their groups with the guidance of counselors.

Registration

Registration Opens January 8 | 9am

This year we are using the CampDocs registration system for camp registration. WE WILL NOT BE USING GSEVENTS.

Choose the 'Events' tab on girlscoutsdiamonds. org to find a program.

Girl programs are searchable by session 1, session 2, session 3, session 4, Troop Camp or Daisy Brownie Camp.

First time visitors to Girl Scouts – Diamonds online registration must become a registered user by creating a profile and password when prompted during the registration process.

Once you complete this step, your information will be stored and available for future registrations.

Choose your program and the link will direct you to register via CampDocs, then proceed through payment options.

➤ Be sure to complete your order. A \$50 nonrefundable deposit is due per camper, per session at the time of registration.

You'll receive an email registration confirmation.

- Programs may be canceled if the minimum number of participants is not met.
- Programs are filled on a first-registered, first-served basis. The online
 system indicates program
 capacity and remaining
 spaces available as well as a
 waitlist.
- Campers will need to register for sessions using their August 2024 grade level.

Waitlist

Being placed on a waitlist does not guarantee placement into the program. Waitlists are dependent on cancellations. If you are removed from the waitlist and placed into a camp, you will receive an email notification with links to make payment.

Notifications will come from tdyer@girlscoutsdiamonds.org. Please check spam/junk folders and mark this as a safe sender.

Membership

All girls participating in summer camp programs must be a registered Girl Scout. It is super easy to register and only \$25. The price increases April 1 to \$35 and covers membership through September 2025. Your camper is not required to be in a troop to attend camp. Any adult spending the night for a family or troop program must be a registered Girl Scout member and have an approved background check. To complete a membership registration, visit GirlScoutsDiamonds.org/join.

Health History Form

A current health history form completed no more than 12 months prior to the Girl Scout's arrival at camp is required for all campers. A form will be linked in the CampDocs registration, please upload the completed form or bring it with you to camp. A physician's signature is required.

NO GIRL WILL BE ADMITTED TO CAMP WITHOUT THIS COMPLETED FORM.

You'll also have time for traditional camping activities like archery, canoeing, and Camp NOARK's challenge course.

CIT II

June 16-21, June 23-28, July 7-12 | \$700

Can you see yourself as a Camp Counselor? This three-week, second-year program will provide you with the tools and training to help you reach your goal! Shadow staff in specific areas of camp, learn more about camp administration, participate in our challenge courses, and more. This program runs the weeks of 6/16-21, 6/23-28, and 7/7-12. You will integrate into units as a junior counselor during 7/7-12. You will go home between weekly programming. Additional program information will be sent after registration. Prerequisite: Must have completed CIT I.



Riding Rookie I

June 9-14 | \$500

Experienced riders comfortable and competent around horses and the facility, who are interested in being junior assistants, come test your strength and knowledge in both equine program and large animal care. When you attend Riding Rookie, you are tandem enrolled in CIT I.

Riding Rookie II

June 16-21. June 23-28, July 7-12 | \$850

Riders who have completed Riding Rookie I, take the next step toward becoming junior barn staff. Aid in program and horse care alongside full-time staff members while you develop your equine Industry knowledge and skills. You will integrate as a barn assistant during 7/7-12. Riding Rookie II is tandem enrolled in CIT II.

Food is crucial to a great camp experience and can be a prime concern for parents and campers alike. One way to keep campers energized and happy is having a quality food service operation. If you ask around, you will hear firsthand how good our food is here at Camp NOARK. These campers are so busy, we want to make sure they have lots of options to choose from so that they get the nutrition they need. We spend a great deal of time planning all the menus, testing and selecting the best food choices and making items available that promote healthy choices and accommodate all dietary restrictions.

Transportation

Most families drop-off and pick-up from camp. If necessary, van transportation is available for a \$65 round trip fee. You will be billed through Square invoice. Payments must be completed the Thursday prior to your camper's session.

Timing

Your camper needs to be at the Little Rock Girl Scout office no later than 12pm on the Sunday of their session. Temperature checks and lice checks will be done before loading the vehicle. The van will arrive back at Merrill Drive by 7:30pm on the Friday of their session.

If van return is delayed, caregivers will be notified via the Remind app. Join the remind classroom <u>@2024camp</u>.

Registration Dates and Signup Link

Registration for transportation will open January 9. You must register for transportation 2 weeks prior to the camper's arrival date. Transportation is not available for Troop Camp. Register for transportation HERE.

Financial Information

Deposits and Fees

A \$50 non-refundable deposit per session is due with each registration. The deposit serves as the first payment of the total camp fee. Deposits must be made through the registration system. All remaining fees must be paid within two weeks of your session start date. You must register by May 16 to receive the camp t-shirt for free. As of May 17, all campers will pay an additional \$10 for their shirt at time of registration. Registration closes two weeks prior to the chosen session start date.

Refund Policy

Refund of camp fees, including Diamonds Dollars, excluding the \$50 deposit and membership fee, will be given for cancellations made by May 10. Camper fees will not be refunded if a camper leaves due to homesickness, illness or misconduct. Camper fees will not be refunded if camper arrives with head lice or a temperature greater than 99 degrees. Camperships are not refundable.



"Camperships" to Camp

What is a "campership"?

Camperships are scholarships funded by the generosity of donors who contribute to our campership fund each year. Our goal is to make camp a possibility for all girls. Financial difficulties should never be the reason a girl can't experience the life-changing lessons found at camp.

How much can we apply for?

First-time applicants may apply for up to 100% of the cost of the camp session, less the \$50 deposit. Second-time applicants may apply for up to 75% of the cost of the camp session, less the \$50 deposit. Third-time applicants can apply for up to 50% of the cost of the camp session, less the \$50 deposit. Priority will be given to first-time applicants.

How do I apply for camperships?

You must register for camp and pay the \$50 deposit, then complete the registration form online.

When is the deadline to apply?

Campership applications open January 9, 2024, and all applications are due by March 31, 2024.

Cookies to Camp

Want to earn a week at camp!? Girl Scouts have an opportunity to earn a week of camp by participating in the 2024 Cookie Program and selling 3,000+ packages of cookies (troop must opt into rewards for Girl Scouts to earn).

Financials/Paying for Camp

Girl Scouts - Diamonds encourages Girl Scouts to participate in Product Programs and select Traditional Diamonds Dollars as a reward to assist in covering camp fees. Girl Scouts can apply Traditional Diamonds Dollars earned through the 2022 Fall Product Program and the 2023 Cookie Program toward 2024 camp fees, excluding the deposit. Traditional Diamonds Dollars earned during these programs do expire on June 30, 2024, so they will need to be applied toward camp balances prior to this date. To apply these funds to a Girl Scout's camp fee balance, call or visit the Diamonds retail shop to process payment.

How much can you earn?

Begin planning for the 2024 camp season now! Diamonds Dollars earned during the 2023 Cookie Program can be applied to 2024 camp registrations. Girl Scouts can select Diamonds Dollars as their preferred reward choice at as many levels as they choose. Diamonds Dollars are cumulative, see the chart to see how much you can earn!

During this 8-day adventure, you'll work on mountain biking skills with experts, explore trails appropriate for your skill level, and even learn some bike maintenance. In addition to mountain biking, you'll go hiking and float down America's first national river!

Your home base will be the Friendship Lodge at Camp NOARK, an easy drive to the world-class mountain biking trails of Hobbs State Park (Monument Trails), Railyard Park, and Lake Atalanta. You will also spend the night at Coler Mountain Bike Preserve, a mecca for biking enthusiasts. We'll take a break from biking to explore Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art, a world-famous art museum nestled in 120 acres of Ozark woods. The trip ends at the Buffalo National River where you will relax in a lodge overlooking the Buffalo, bike the Buffalo trails, and canoe down the river.

Who Should Apply?

Age: Girl Scouts entering grades 10–12, or who have just graduated 12th grade.

Requirements: You must have experience riding a bicycle (mountain biking experience preferred, but not required), and the ability to participate in physically-challenging experiences.


Program fee: \$1,350

FAQ

Who can attend Girl Scout summer camp?

Summer camp is open to all campers in grades K-12. Each session has grade requirements which must be met to prioritize the health, safety and well-being of all campers.

My camper is not a Girl Scout member but would like to attend camp. Can they attend and are there additional fees?

Yes, Girl Scout camps are open to all. Campers who are not members of Girl Scouts will pay an additional \$25 from January 8–March 31 or an additional \$35 beginning April 1 to cover their membership registration. The \$25 fee will allow the camper to be a registered member of Girl Scouts through September 30, 2024, and the \$35 is an extended year membership covering until September 30, 2025.

When does Girl Scout summer camp registration open?

Registration opens January 8, 2024, at 9am. Be on the lookout for a SPECIAL SALE starting November 24!

Can campers attend with a friend?

Yes! Camp NOARK can place campers with a buddy. Buddies must be in the same age group and register for the same session. Both buddies should request the other's name during registration. We only allow campers to choose one buddy.

How is my child safe?

Your camper's safety is our number one priority. We follow state licensing, ACA accreditation, and Girl Scout safety standards which include, but are not limited to:

- ▶ Background checks for all adult camp staff and volunteers.
- ➤ Certified lifeguards, health supervisors, and high-risk activity instructors.
- ➤ Training for all staff and volunteers to prioritize your camper's physical and emotional wellbeing.

Can campers bring a cell phone?

No. Our camps are unplugged to let campers connect with nature, others, and themselves. The camp director will contact caregivers if a camper has a medical problem, is excessively homesick, or has an emergency.

Is my camper ready for camp?

Yes! At both day and overnight camp, campers will be paired with others their own age and participate in activities appropriate for their level of camp experience. They will create memories that will last a lifetime and stories they will look forward to sharing with you. If you are considering camp for the first time, try Troop Camp or our Daisy Brownie Camp.

Why is CIT II \$700?

A regular week of camp is \$425. CIT II campers are attending two weeks as campers and have a \$150 discount due to the time they are spending immersed with girls practicing the skills they are learning. The third week of CIT II is spent as a Junior Counselor in unit with girls. You are not being charged for this week.

Why is equine programming more than regular?

Our equine program is incredible. There is a \$30 per barn day fee assessed to each equine camp session to support the equine program.

Who are the camp staff and volunteers?

We select talented, experienced, and caring adults to serve as role models and caretakers. They are selected because they have a genuine desire to work with campers and are trained in areas such as first aid and CPR, emergency procedures, child development, mental and behavioral health, working through homesickness, team building, and more.

What certifications do staff have?

- ➤ Youth Mental Health First Aid, CPR/First Aid, various activity certifications including Archery, Lifeguard, Low Ropes, BB gun, Hatchet and Knife Throwing, etc
- ➤ Kitchen staff is ServSafe certified.
- NOARK Camp Director is a certified camp director with American Camp Association, holds a F.A.R.E. certification and is a Leave No Trace Trainer.
- STEAM Center Camp Director is a certified day camp director with American Camp Association.
- ➤ Equine Manager is a Certified Horsemanship Association instructor.
