We have recently advertised the coveted posts of Head Girl, Head Boy and Student Leaders to join our Student Leadership Team.



Academy upgrades!

We are really excited to update you on progress with our £1.64 million project to refurbish and upgrade our school!our school buildings!

As part of the first phase of the project, improvements were made to the training shed. The existing heating and lighting within the training shed was replaced, meaning that the building is not only now better lit and warmer, but also, more energy efficient.

Work is currently being finalised on the second phase of the project, which involves relocating the current canteen and dining area to the old changing rooms and gym. The new design will allow more students to access the canteen and the facilities provided will enable us to offer a wider selection of food.

Over the summer holidays, work will continue around the school site. A new, modern 6th form canteen will be created which will provide high quality food in a cafe style environment. Food technology classrooms will also be upgraded allowing students to experience cooking in a fantastic environment with the most up to date equipment.

To complete the work, the outside yard will be resurfaced and covered seating will be installed; this will allow students to use the facilities safely all year round.

We cannot wait to welcome you to our new environment soon!
